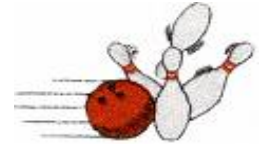




# Fisher Catholic Bowling



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## Questions and Answers

- Q. Is Bowling really a High School Sport?
- A. Yes. Beginning in the 2006-2007 school year, the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) recognized Bowling as an official Winter Sport at the High School level.
- Q. How long has Fisher Catholic had a Bowling program?
- A. Since the 2005-2006 school year.
- Q. How many teams does FC have?
- A. Every year except one, FC has been able to field a Varsity and a JV team for both Boys and Girls.
- Q. Do I have to try out?
- A. Yes. There is a three day try-out held each year in November. It is required that you attend at least 2 of the three days. You will bowl a minimum of 6 games and a maximum of 9 games. Try-out dates will be posted and announced by November 1st each year.
- Q. Does everyone make the team?
- A. No. The coach will take your 6 highest games to determine a per game average. That average along with the coach's observations will determine who makes the team. Attitude, technique and experience are the biggest factors considered when determining a cut. The teams will be limited to 7 bowlers each but a bowler may be moved from Varsity to JV depending on the needs of each match.
- Q. Who does FC Bowling compete with?
- A. FC is in the South Central Ohio Conference (SCOC) along with Lancaster, Zanesville, Maysville, Logan, Chillicothe and New Lexington. We also compete against other Mid State League schools such as Granville, Circleville and Teays Valley. Our schedule will include up to 24 matches.
- Q. When does the season start and end?
- A. November 4, 2011 is the first day coaching can begin with the State Tournament being held the first weekend in March of 2012.
- Q. What does a match consist of?
- A. Each match consists of 4 games. 2 games are standard 10 pin games where 5 bowlers will roll a complete game each. The other games are Baker style games where 5 bowlers will combine to roll a complete game by rolling 2 frames each. The total pinfall of all 4 games are added together and the team with the highest pinfall wins the match. There is no handicap in High School Bowling.
